What is CCC marking and licensing?

CCC, which stands for China Compulsory Certification, is a **compulsory** safety licensing and associated marking system affecting many products imported for sale on the Chinese market. Chinese port authorities may **impose product quarantines or other penalties on importers of** products not meeting CCC licensing requirements.

...and RoHS?

RoHS, which stands for Restriction of Hazardous Substances, is an acronym derived from the European Union Directive on the Restriction of the Use of Certain Hazardous Substances in Electrical and Electronic Equipment (see <http://eur-lex.europa.eu/LexUriServ/LexUriServ.do?uri=CELEX:32002L0095:EN:HTML>). This EU Directive focuses on the restriction of certain hazardous materials in certain electronic and electrical equipment. China RoHS covers similar substance restrictions, but also imposes compliance certification requirements and, on a wide array of "electronic information products," a series of labeling and information disclosure requirements.
